Subsequent Enrollment Analysis of the Fall 2020 First Year and Transfer Admitted Students

Summary

During the Fall 2020 application cycle, the campus received 23,941 applications for first-year admission. 16,558 applications received favorable decisions, for an admitted student headcount of 16,419. By census, 3,541 new first-year students had enrolled for fall term. To contribute to the continued evaluation and improvement of the recruitment, admission, and yield efforts, this report considers the enrollment decision of the admitted students who opted to not enroll at UIC. That is, asking: **if not UIC, then where?** The National Student Clearinghouse (NSC) Student Tracker services was used to verify subsequent enrollment of students who were admitted but did not enroll at UIC (ANE). Of approximately 13,017 individual records submitted to NSC, 11,131 enrollment records were returned with an enrollment record at one of the 3,600 institutions across the U.S. participating in NSC. A total of 62% are attending an institution in Illinois; 60% are at a public institution in the U.S. Results from admitted, not enrolled analyses provide insights to UIC competitors. Disaggregated results are included and allow for understanding enrollment choices of different populations.

Methods

Records of the admitted and enrolled students were extracted from the application and registration databases. The first year application, admit and enroll pool disaggregated by racial/ethnic group is shown in Table 1. This represents the total individuals applying for admission. Table 2 shows the application pool by college and thus represents the total applications submitted. The overall individual admit rate was 72.2% (percentage of admitted individual applicants) and the yield rate was 21.6% (percentage of enrolled individual admits). These rates vary across different race/ethnic groups and colleges.

Results

Submission of the ANE population resulted in 11,131 usable records from the NSC, which represents about 86% of the ANE total. Of the 11,131, 85% are enrolled at 4-year institutions and 60% at public institutions (rates pretty similar to prior years). Illinois institutions enrolled 62% of the students with NSC records, up from 59% for the Fall 2019 class. The breakout of enrollment by institution type (2-year/4-year) and control (public/private) is shown in Table 4.

Table 5 provides the number of students enrolled at each of the top 30 institutions of subsequent enrollment with the percent of total records and detail by college. Due to large differences between total number of ANE and subsequent enrollment record counts, the college data in Table 5 are presented as percentage of total ANE records for each college. For example, the 1,709 students enrolled at UIUC represents 15.4% of the total subsequent enrollments (N=11,131). For CBA, it is 14.4% of the 1,439 total subsequent enrollment records tied to CBA; similarly for Engineering, UIUC enrollment represents 24.5% of the 1,789 subsequent enrollments. The bottom two rows of the table show the total number of students reflected in the ANE file and the total number of different institutions reflected in the ANE enrollments.

Table 6 displays the top ten institutions of subsequent enrollments by rank order, with the comparison rank place of the institution for the Fall 2015, 2016, 2017, 2018, and 2019. This information provides a context of the consistency and movement of the key competitor institutions. For the first time since 2015, a new school – CCC: Wright College – entered the top five institutions, flipping spots with IIT.

Like Table 6, Table 7 provides a historical context showing the top 30 subsequent enrollment institutions for Fall 2020 (with percentage of the ANE records at each) in contrast to the Fall 2019 figures for the institutions. For example, 1,709 ANE students are enrolled at UIUC in Fall 2020 – 15.4% of the ANE records. In Fall 2019, the number was 1,587, which accounted for 14.8% of the ANE records. The change from last year to this year (+122 in the case of UIUC) is included in the far-right column. DePaul also saw a sizable increase of 169 students to a total of 784 ANE students in Fall 2020, which represented 7% of all the ANE records.

Racial and Ethnic diversity is a key point of interest for campus enrollment. Tables 8 through 11 display the top 20 subsequent institutions of enrollment for Asian, Black/African American, Hispanic and White students, respectively. There were 2,204 Asian students with an NSC record, enrolled at 287 different institutions. For the other groups the counts were: 1,233 at 294 institutions for Black/African American students; 3,552 Hispanic students enrolled at 394 institutions; and 3,059 White students at 461 institutions.

Geographic diversity is examined through the residency status of the student. Of the total admitted pool, Illinois residents comprise around 80% with domestic, non-Illinois residents totaling 17% and International at 3%. Table 12 shows the top institutions of subsequent enrollment for domestic non-residents and International admits.

Tables 13-16 show the subsequent enrollments of students disaggregated by ACT concordance scores– a measure of pre-enrollment academic preparation. Four quartile groups are presented, with the first quartile including ANE records with a 21 ACT Composite or lower, second quartile ACT 22-24, third quartile ACT 25-28, and the fourth quartile including ACT scores of 29 or higher. The top institutions remain relatively consistent across the groups, followed by more distinct enrollment choices for each ACT group.

Appendix A

Constructing the Data Set

The data were received from NSC in early November. Multiple enrollment records may be reported, for example, in instances of summer and fall enrollment at different institutions and dual enrollments. In instances where the NSC response file reflected multiple institutions of enrollment, the criteria to establish a single subsequent enrollment record: (a) if concurrent enrollment reflected a part-time and full-time attendance, the institution of full-time attendance was used. And (b) if concurrent enrollment reflected a two-year and four-year institution, the four-year institution was used.

Appendix B

Transfer Admitted, Not Enrolled: Fall 2019 snapshot

The following tables represent a snapshot of the subsequent enrollment institutions for the Fall 2020 Transfer admits who did not enroll at UIC. Given UIC's strong yield numbers in transfer applicants, this population is significantly smaller than that of the first-year pool; a more longitudinal analysis will be done to factor in more years and spring term admissions.

For Fall 2020, UIC received 6,289 transfer applications and offered admission to 3,780 individual transfer applicants. At census, 2,319 new transfer students were enrolled, leaving 1,461 transfer ANE submitted to NSC. Of that group, 972 usable records were returned and are broken down in Table B1 and Table B2 by 2-year/4-year and Public/Private institutions. In Table B3 and Table B4, the top 20 Transfer ANE institutions are broken down by race/ethnicity and college.

Appendix C

Summary of survey responses from those rejecting admission

Admitted applicants who reject UIC's offer of admission are invited to complete a survey about their decision and reasoning. Over 700 surveys were submitted in 2020, up from 527 the prior year. The survey remains predominantly first-year applicants at 93% of responses. Tables C1 and C2 show the 2020 respondents by Race and Ethnicity and the admitting college, respectively. Table C3 breaks down responses to the question of where UIC ranked in the students' college choice list at the time of application.

Table C4 combines responses from the last two years to questions on why the student rejected UIC's offer admission and why they accepted another offer of admission. Financial Aid and cost of attendance remain the biggest factors in respondent's decision to reject UIC. Financial Aid, surpassing the top response of Program Reputation in 2019, was also the primary reason for accepting another offer of admission. Program Offering was a new option added in 2020 and a strong reason for students who are, for example, looking for direct entry into a Nursing program in their first year of college. Below, Table C5 visualizes the primary rejection reasons by the four largest race/ethnicity categories.

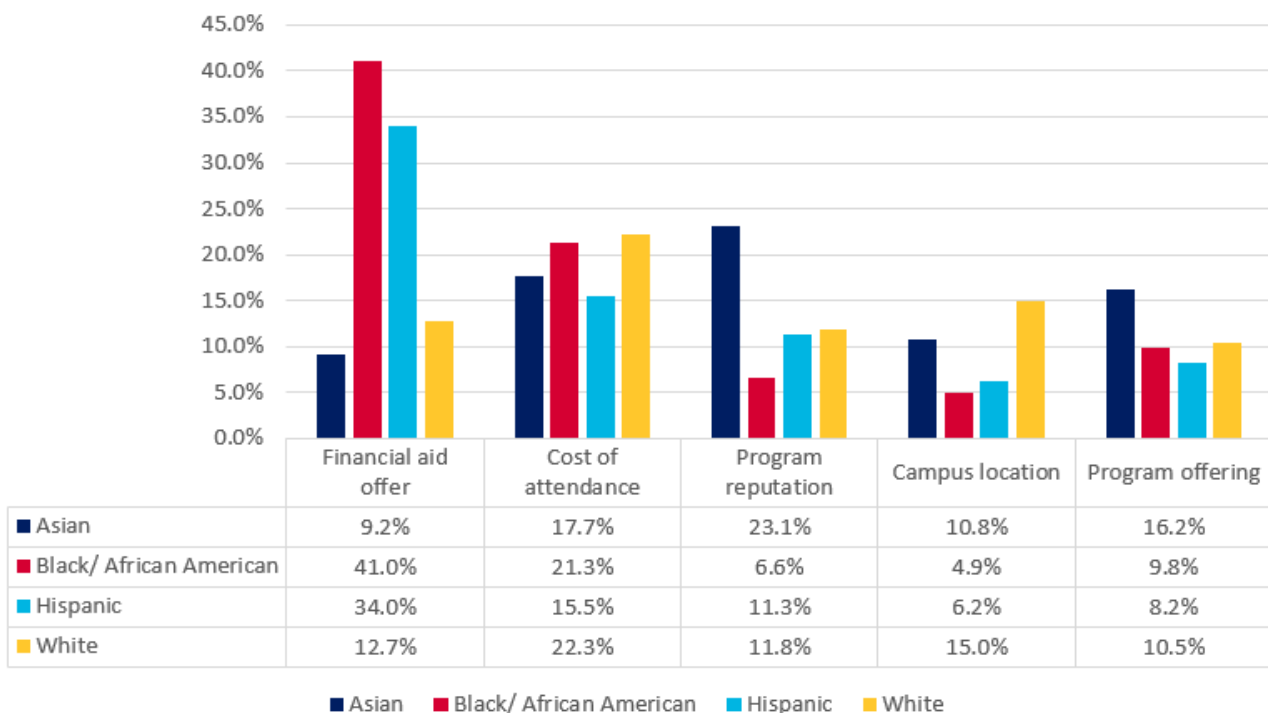
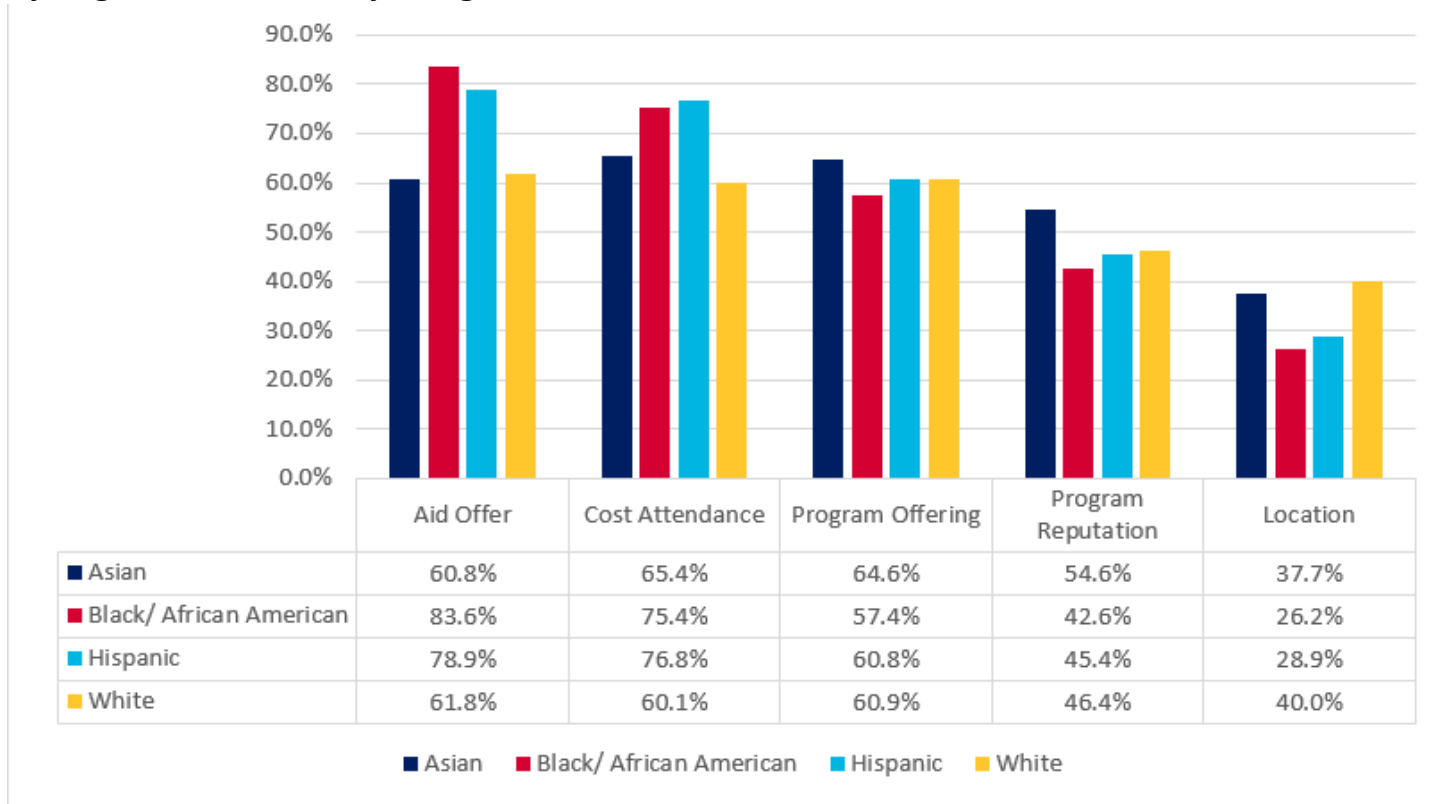


Table C6, using the same five factors highlighted in Table C5, illustrates the percentages of students who considered the factors either Critically Important or Very Important in making their college choice.
