

## Fall 2016 Non-Returning Students Report

### Subsequent enrollment analysis of students eligible to return who did not return

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#### Executive Summary

Over the past few years, the UIC retention and graduate rates have hovered near 80 percent and 60 percent respectively. This report documents the enrollment patterns of students who left UIC despite being eligible to return for the Fall 2016 term. The National Student Clearinghouse contains data on 98 percent of all students enrolled in public and private postsecondary institutions. The current report includes Fall 2014 and 2015 comparisons.

A total of 16,099 degree-seeking undergraduates completed the Spring 2016 semester. Of that total, 2,755 students graduated, 252 were dropped for academic reasons, and 60 students withdrew registration during the semester. In Fall 2016, 12,163 students returned to UIC. Therefore, 869 of the Spring 2016 students eligible to return did not return to UIC in Fall 2016. The report reveals a smaller number of students leaving UIC for other institutions in 2016 compared to previous years (353 compared to 445 in 2015). The proportion of non-returning students with subsequent enrollment decreased from 46 percent in 2014 to 41 percent in 2016. Although the proportion of non-returning students with subsequent enrollment is lower than in previous years, almost six in 10 of all non-returning students do not have subsequent enrollment records at any other institution. Also, about half of all students with subsequent enrollment at other institutions attended 2-year institutions. In 2016, the University of Illinois at Urbana Champaign (UIUC) became the top institutions with subsequent enrollment despite experiencing a decrease in the overall number of students with subsequent enrollment. This report also reveals college and racial/ethnic variation in the top subsequent enrollment institutions.

## Results

**Table 1** reports the demographic distribution of undergraduates who were eligible to return in Fall 2016 but did not return. Overall, seven percent of all UIC eligible undergraduates did not return in Fall 2016. Eligible undergraduates are defined as students who completed the Spring 2016 semester and did not graduate, did not withdraw, and were not academically dropped from the University. Student financial hardship was not a criterion for eligibility to return. Therefore, many students in this report may not have returned to UIC for financial reasons. Approximately 9 percent of eligible Black students did not enroll in Fall 2016. Only 4 in every 10 eligible juniors did not return in Fall 2016. In the College of Architecture Design and the Arts and the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences each, eight percent of all eligible students did not return in Fall 2016.

**Table 2** compares the Fall 2014 and Fall 2016 proportion of non-returning students with subsequent enrollment at other institutions. Overall, there was a five percentage point decrease in the proportion of non-returning students with subsequent enrollment from 2014 to 2016. The proportion of non-returning students with subsequent enrollment has decreased across all demographic groups except for college seniors who experienced a two percentage point increase in the proportion of non-returning students with subsequent enrollment.

**Table 3** presents the number and percentages of non-returning students who have no record of subsequent enrollment at other institutions in Fall 2016. It is likely that these students did not enroll at any other institution after leaving UIC. Approximately 65 percent of Black non-returning students have no subsequent enrollment at other institutions. Seven in every 10 students not in good academic standing have no subsequent enrollment record at other institutions. Over half of all non-returning sophomores and more than eight in 10 of all non-returning seniors had no subsequent enrollment record at other institutions. In the College of Business, 69 percent of non-returning students have no subsequent enrollment records.

**Table 4** reports the 2016 non-returning students with subsequent enrollment by type of institution enrolled. Overall, just under half (48%) of all non-returning students with subsequent enrollment attended 2-year institutions. Over one-third of the students who attended a 2-year institution were not in good standing in their last semester at UIC. Of the 52 percent of students who attended 4-year institutions 14 percent were not in good in good standing in their last semester at UIC.

**Table 5** compares the top 12 subsequent enrollment institutions from 2015 to 2016. In 2016, the top five subsequent enrollment institutions are UIUC, Moraine Valley Community College, College of DuPage, Harold Washington College, and Oakton Community College. From 2015 to 2016, subsequent enrollment decreased most substantially (17 students) from the College of DuPage. UIUC decreased subsequent enrollment by five students despite increasing its ranking from second to first in 2016. Subsequent enrollment increased most substantially at Joliet Junior College (5 students). Moraine Valley Community College also increase subsequent enrollment by two students and has risen from having the fourth highest subsequent enrollment in 2015 to having the second highest subsequent enrollment in 2016.

**Tables 6-9** compare Black White, Hispanic and Asian non-returning students with subsequent from 2015 to 2016. All racial/ethnic groups have decreased their number of students with subsequent enrollment except Black students who have six more students with subsequent enrollment at other institutions in 2016 than in 2015. Two more Black students have subsequent enrollment at UIUC, Kennedy King, and Oakton Community College in 2016 compared to 2015. White students have increase subsequent enrollment at Joliet Junior College, DePaul University, and Moraine Valley Community College. Although still the top subsequent enrollment institution for this group, six fewer Asian students have subsequent enrollment at UIUC in 2016 compared to 2015.

**Table A.1** reports the 2015 distribution of top 11 subsequent enrollment institutions by UIC college. In 2015, Applied Health Sciences students enrolled at William Rainey Harper College and Resurrection University in higher proportions than the general UIC population. Also, both the College of Business and the College of Architecture Design and the Arts had disproportionately higher subsequent enrollment at Harold Washington College compared to the general campus.

**Table A.2** presents the 2016 distribution of top subsequent enrollment institutions by UIC college. In 2016, Applied Health Sciences students subsequently enrolled at Joliet Junior College and the College of Lake County in higher proportions than the general UIC population. The College of Engineering has disproportionately more students subsequently enrolled in the College of DuPage compared to the general UIC population. Both the College of Business and the College of Architecture Design and the Arts had subsequent enrollment at Harold Washington College and Oakton Community College that was disproportionate to the general campus. Harold Washington has disproportionately enrolled more students than the general campus from the College of Business Administration and the College Architecture Design and the Arts in 2015 and 2016.
